Emergency Medical Technicians respond to emergency calls and provide efficient and immediate care to the critically ill and injured, then transport the patient to a medical facility.

The EMT provides basic life support and other critical care functions such including patient assessment, airway management, and using automatic defibrillators. The EMT is responsible for driving the ambulance in a safe manner under all conditions.

The EMT must understand all applicable legal, moral and ethical issues surrounding emergency medical service. Successful EMT candidates must:

- Be confident and accept the challenge and high degree of responsibility
- Have excellent judgment, be able to prioritize decisions & act quickly in the patient's best interest
- Be able to function at an optimum level in a non-structured environment that is constantly changing
- Be able to remain calm while working in difficult and stressful situations
- Have good judgment, along with knowledge and technical skills

The EMT Career Program can prepare you to deliver critical service as a primary care provider in a pre-hospital setting. If you have excellent communication skills, are adaptable to a variety of situations, and possess critical reasoning skills - then a career as an EMT professional may be perfect for you!

To enter this program for non-credit career training, students must:

- Be 18 years of age
- Meet application deadline
- Meet all licensure requirements
- Attend orientation session

Refunds/Withdrawals
