Guin Robinson appointed to the Alabama Historical Commission

In August, Governor Bob Riley appointed Guin Robinson to the Alabama Historical Commission.

Robinson is the director of institutional development for Jefferson State Community College. In this role he works with various communities in which JSCC is located and assists with grants management for the College.

From 2004-2006, he was the executive director of Region 2020. Robinson was elected as the first full-time mayor of Pell City in 2000, and has long been involved in regional efforts. Beginning in January 2003, he served as chairman of the Regional Planning Commission of Greater Birmingham. He also has served as co-chair of the Regional Growth Alliance. Additionally, Robinson is a member of the Campaign Catalyst Committee of the Community Foundation of Greater Birmingham, a celebration of the Community Foundation of Birmingham's 50th Anniversary

A native of Ashland, Guin was named Academic Alumni of the Year from Clay County High School in 2002 and was named by the Birmingham News as one of the 15 Leaders for the Future. He has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Public Administration from Auburn University and a Masters in Education Leadership from UAB.

Robinson is an at-large member and replaced Guy Spencer.

According to Executive Director Frank White, "I am grateful for the dedication and expertise Commissioner Spencer shared with us during his service, and we look forward to working with Commissioner Robinson. He is an excellent addition to the commission."
