

DID YOU KNOW?

- Jefferson State is an excellent value for your educational dollar. Annual tuition is approximately fifty percent (50%) of the tuition to attend a four-year university in Alabama.
- Jefferson State students come from a diverse background, with more than eighty five percent (85%) calling Jefferson, Shelby, St. Clair and Chilton counties home.
- More than forty percent (40%) of Jefferson State students are enrolled in one of the 120 Associate of Arts or Science university transfer programs. These programs allow students to transfer to a public four-year university in Alabama without loss of credit hours.
- Jefferson State Radiologic Technology program graduates have achieved 100% job placement over the past seven years.
- The Culinary Program was one of only 10 postsecondary programs recognized by the American Culinary Federation Foundation Accrediting Commission (ACFFAC) as exemplary at the 2008 ACF Southeast Regional Conference.
- Jefferson State leads the state in the number of graduates from its nursing programs. More than sixteen percent (16%) of our students are enrolled in the nursing programs. Our LPN and RN programs have both received superior evaluations from the National League for Nursing.
- More than 12,000 individuals were involved in workforce training activities in 2008 through Jefferson State's Center for Community and Corporate Education. This is in addition to the 8,300 students enrolled in an academic degree program.
- Jefferson State's Child Development Program is the first in Alabama to be accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). This makes Alabama one of only 15 states to currently hold the distinction of having an accredited childhood associate degree program.
- Jefferson State administers one of the largest dual enrollment programs in the state, which allows high school students to take college courses and receive both high school and college credit. In Fall 2009, there were 727 dually-enrolled high school students in the program.
- Jefferson State has one of the largest GED programs in the state. Jefferson State realized its highest enrollment to date with 1,671 students in 2008-2009.
- Jefferson State has more than 7,400 students enrolled in one of the 171 web-based courses offered through our Distance Learning initiative.
